In the comfort of your love, I pour out to you, my Saviour, The memories that haunt me, The anxieties that perplex me, The fears that stifle me, The sickness that prevails upon me, And the frustration of all the pain that weaves about within me. Lord, help me to see your peace in my turmoil, your compassion in my sorrow, your forgiveness in my weakness, And, your love in my need. Touch me, O Lord, with your healing power and strength.

#### CHY3 Forms

The Charitable Donation Scheme allows tax relief on qualifying donations made to approved bodies. If an individual donates €250 or more in a year, the approved body can claim a refund of tax paid on that donation. Beechwood Avenue parish is an approved body for the purposes of this scheme. The income we receive is a very important source of revenue for the parish each year and we are very grateful to everyone who assists us in this way.

### A Holistic Approach to Nature

In the words of Pope Francis, "Nature cannot be regarded as something separate from ourselves or as a mere setting in which we live" (LS 139). Our interactions with the environment are woven into the fabric of economic, political, social, cultural, and ethical dimensions. Our planet provides us with everything we need to survive and thrive - food, building matter, fuel, materials for clothing and transport, the raw materials for our modern lives. In our use of these commodities we need to be respectful of Creation, not merely plundering what we can to the detriment of Nature, to the detriment of Future Generations.

### **Helping Nature to Help Us**

Pope Francis reminds us that Nature doesn't perform just for its own benefit, it is part of a sharing ecosystem: "Rivers do not drink their own water; trees do not eat their own fruit; the Sun does not shine on itself and flowers do not spread their fragrance for themselves. Living for others is a rule of nature. We are all born to help each other. No matter how difficult it is.... Life is good when you are happy; but much better when others are happy because of you."
