Return & Recycle

Those of you of a certain age will remember scouring the ditches for empty Fanta bottles that could be swapped for a few pence and immediately converted to sweets. Now those discarded plastic bottles that litter our parks and streets might become just as coveted, ending up in the Reverse Vending Machines in local supermarkets and shops.

While the green bin was collecting 60% of used cans and plastic bottles, 40% was not being recycled. The main issue is that most canned and bottled beverages are not generally consumed in the home – the majority are bought for on-the-go. At best, the empty can or bottle is disposed of in a street bin and not recycled. At worst, it litters roadsides, waterways or ends up in the ocean.

EU Circular Economy legislation calls for Ireland to have a dedicated collection of 77% of beverage bottles by 2025. By 2029, we have to be collecting at least 90%. This is where the incentive of a deposit scheme fits in. Yes, it is an inconvenience for those householders who up to now just used the green bin (you still can, if you are happy to forgo reclaiming the deposit!) but won't it be nice to get on a bus or Luas and not have a can rolling in the aisle? Or pass a public bin that is not overflowing with bottles and cans?

A Quote from Laudato Si:

"No one can ignore the fact that in recent years we have witnessed extreme weather phenomena, frequent periods of unusual heat, drought and other cries of protest on the part of the earth, that are only a few palpable expressions of a silent disease that affects everyone" [LD §5]

Laudato Si' (2015) is the second encyclical of Pope Francis. This encyclical has the subtitle "on care for our common home". It is a worldwide wake up call to help humanity understand the destruction that man is rendering to the environment and his fellow man.
